**Sub:-** Approval of PIP prepared based on Base line Survey undertaken during March-April 2013

**Ref:-** Letter No. W-11013/01/2011-CRSP, dated 04.11.2013 of Director (NBA), Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, New Delhi

With reference to the subject mentioned above the Baseline Survey in Karnataka State was undertaken and completed in March-April 2013 as per the instructions of Government of India. The Gram Panchayat is uploading the results of the Base Line Survey as per format prescribed by the Government of India on the Website of Ministry of Rural Drinking Water Supply. The certification of completion has also been sent to the office of Director, MoRDWS, New Delhi.

1. Karnataka State has identified 1,28,324 toilets in 30 districts as dysfunctional toilets. We hereby certify that the revised PIP targets do not include any households that had earlier received incentive under TSC/NBA even if the toilets have become dysfunctional
2. **(i) Comparison of Census & Baseline survey figures**

- Census was conducted in 2010-11 and the Baseline Survey of NBA was conducted in the state in Dec 2012 to March 2013. Some % increase in households in identified in Baseline survey is due to population growth in the state in 2 years , post completion of Census in 2011.
- 3,73,421 houses were newly constructed in the sate under IAY and other state rural housing schemes which attributes to 49% of increased households. (2011-12,12-13)
- Census survey has not said to have recorded details of households in encroached Govt Land.

**(ii) Comparison of Baseline survey 2004 & 2012 data**

Base Line Survey (BLS) was conducted in Karnataka State in the months of December 2012 upto March 2013 .As per the findings of this baseline survey, out of a total of 8661252 (5441068 BPL) and (3220184 APL) rural households, total of 56,37,831 (3659533 BPL & 1978298 APL) Households do not have individual household toilets and are yet to be covered under the NBA. In addition to the above uncovered households, the BLS has also brought out that there are 128324 dysfunctional toilets in the State.

**a. BPL Households**

- The % of BPL households without IHHL was 39.7% in 2004 has increased to 42.2% in 2012 as 19 lakh new BPL households has been added since 2004.
- Breakup of the proposed revised BPL objective 36,59,533 (ie HHs without IHHL)
  - 8.93 lakhs are part of 2004 Objective year to be achieved
  - 19 lakhs are new households due to growth in the last 10 years
  - 8.76 lakhs is over reported figures in IMIS.

**Explanation:** The state has reported 19,96,395 BPL households as covered on 31.3.2012. Both physical and financial progress were verified to ascertain the figures reported, and it was found that the state has made financial expenditure which has enabled construction of only 11.2 lakhs IHHL, hence 8.76 lakhs has been said to have been over reported figures.



The survey works is a field level activity and there is bound to be changes every time this activity is carried out. The same may be seen in the case of Karnataka state , as per census data of 2011 and baseline survey 2012 of NBA, there is an increase of approximately 7 lakhs rural households. Hence, the Baseline survey figures of 2012 are also likely to undergo changes in due course. Due to vast expanse of field exercise involved in the survey work in India, results have always been subject to variation despite all efforts and checks and balances.

This submission is not to justify the variations crept in, but to emphasize that the State is committed to start this process afresh and with reasonable checks and balances to reduce any kind of grave error.
